In context, a solar property tax exemption means the value added by solar panels is entirely exempt from your property's tax assessment. You don't pay tax on that portion at all.

Generally, if the solar PV system is used by a tax-exempt entity such as a school, municipal utility, government agency, or charity, the ITC may not be claimed.
